HIWAN HOMESTEAD MUSEUM**

Hiwan Homestead Museum is very excited to announce two new exhibits in honor of the 100th anniversary of the Model T. Come enjoy “Fit to a T”, a new exhibit of vintage clothing from the Model T era (1908-1927), invoking memories of flappers, automobile touring, and lawn parties. The majority of this clothing comes from the collection of the Jefferson County Historical Society, with several pieces on loan from the Historic Costume and Textiles Collection at Colorado State University.

The other exhibit showcases American-made dolls from the collection housed at Hiwan Homestead Museum. The exhibit features both storybook dolls and folk art dolls, as well as other examples from the late 19th through the middle of the 20th centuries.

These two exhibits can be seen at Hiwan Homestead Museum now through June 22, 2008. Museum admission is free to the public during open hours. Please call 303-674-6262 for more information.

Hiwan Homestead Museum is a 17-room log mansion constructed in the Rustic style of architecture. It is located in Evergreen at 4208 S. Timbervale Drive and is operated through a partnership between Jefferson County Open Space and the Jefferson County Historical Society. The Museum was listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1974.
